Position Primary Purpose				

The Senior Clinician Podiatrist will provide client centred and evidence-based podiatry assessment, intervention and education to all AccessHC Podiatry clients as part of a multi-disciplinary allied health team.

Clients referred to podiatry services are seen under a variety of funding streams, including but not limited to: Community Health, Commonwealth Home Support Program (CHSP), Home and Community Care (HACC), Home Care Package/ Support at Home (HCP/SaH), Integrated Chronic Disease Management (ICDM), National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS), Medicare Benefits Scheme (MBS), Private Fee for Service, and future grants and funding opportunities.

The Senior Clinician Podiatrist will complete consultations primarily face to face in clinic, or via telehealth or home-based services. The Senior Clinician will engage with clients, carers, family, support workers and other health professionals to support the health and wellbeing needs of clients, including but not limited to: general podiatry care, diabetes foot assessment and intervention, high-risk foot assessment and intervention, wound care, biomechanical assessment and intervention, orthotics, musculoskeletal issues, nail surgery, paediatrics and complex chronic disease management.

The Senior Clinician Podiatrist may also facilitate referral triage, group education sessions, support sharing of information with stakeholders, and contribute to health promotion activities, tertiary student supervision and relevant health related programs.

In addition to the above, the Senior Clinician Podiatrist will provide clinical supervision and practice support to Grade 1 and Grade 2 Podiatrists across the Outer East and Manningham regions, provide direction and support to Allied Health Assistants, actively participate in annual work plans and KPI review, ensure that evidence-based clinical practice standards are met, and that all clients receive a high-quality service. Under a multidisciplinary team model, the Senior Clinician Podiatrist will work closely with all allied health disciplines and managers across the Allied Health Outer East Team, Podiatry Team, GPs, Practice nurses, Mental Health and AOD, Dental, and Service Connection at Access Health and Community. This will extend to partnership and liaison with external stakeholders.

The Senior Clinician Podiatrist role will encompass approximately 0.6 FTE undertaking a clinical case load and approximately 0.2 FTE as dedicated time to support Senior Clinician Responsibilities.
