Division Purpose – News and Current Affairs

The principal purpose of SBS News and Current Affairs is to provide the most accurate, balanced and detailed coverage of international and major domestic news across all platforms. It is our role to deliver depth and analysis to help our audiences understand often complex issues. Also key, is to showcase stories from within our many communities that reflect on multiculturalism & Indigenous affairs, as well as their diverse perspectives across all our coverage.

Role Purpose

SBS's News and Current Affairs Journalism Cadetship is a 12-month program designed to develop skills and experience in journalism. During the year, Cadets are based in Sydney's cross-platform newsrooms (World News and NITV News), with placements in Melbourne and Canberra newsrooms, with the current affairs programs Dateline and Insight. It's also a unique opportunity to meet the most multilingual and diverse team of journalists in Australia.



Main Responsibilities

Main tasks of the role

- 1. Working in a fully integrated cross-platform newsroom that produces stories for TV, Radio and Online.
- 2. Perform and/or assist with reporting, producing, researching and other tasks for SBS news and current affairs programs under the direction of editorial leaders and other senior journalists.
- 3. Ensure that content produced complies with SBS's Charter obligations, Codes of Conduct, Editorial Guidelines and other relevant standards and formats (under the direction of the senior Journalists and Executives).
- 4. Undertake and complete training courses as directed.
- 5. Engage in clear and open communication with team members and uphold SBS values.
 6. Other duties as directed.

- Familiarity with shooting and editing video for digital and broadcast will be highly regarded.
