Statement of Faith

We believe, uphold and teach the fundamental truths of Christianity contained in Holy Scriptures, including:

- The sovereignty of God, who despite the effects of sin on the world, retains authority over all creation, sustaining and governing all things by His will.

- The universal sinfulness and guilt of human nature since the Fall, rendering man subject to God's wrath and condemnation.
- The incarnation of Jesus, conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.
- Redemption from the guilt, penalty and power of sin only through the sacrificial and atoning death of Jesus Christ as our representative and substitute.
