Working closely with the Learning Leader – Visual Arts and subject teachers, the Visual Arts Assistant contributes to a positive and inspiring learning atmosphere that fosters creativity, collaboration and artistic growth across the College community.

Teaching and Learning Support

- Assist teachers ad Learning Leaders in coordinating and delivering Visual Arts programs that support student learning and engagement.
- Prepare materials, equipment, and learning spaces for classes, workshops, and co-curricular activities.
- Support students during lessons, fostering participation, creativity, and skill development.
- Perform tasks including classroom and storeroom maintenance, class preparations for all classes
- Support the Visual Arts Program with the Subject Teacher/Learning Leader to meet the goals of the program for the students
- Provide assistance to the programs (curricular and cocurricular programs) by working with the students and supporting their participation in the program.
- Room maintenance such as cleaning and storage.
- Administration including maintaining stock levels and ordering.
- Assist with College events.
- General and ad hoc tasks as requested by the Learning Leader Visual Arts.
