POSITION OVERVIEW

Caring for Country Rangers undertake a variety of Land & Sea Management tasks and planning. Tasks can include Weed control, fire work, marine patrols, managing feral animals/pests, and cultural site management.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES & ACCOUNTABILITIES

- Undertake work activities described in the annual work program. Depending on the ranger group you work in, this may include all or some of the following tasks:
 - Controlled burning (aerial and on the ground)
 - Weed control activities
 - Feral animal control activities
 - Marine patrols
 - Water quality testing and other related work
 - Cultural site management
- Engage in planning and review of annual work programs.
- Provide reports of activities and observations on a regular basis.
- Undertake training and development activities as required.
- Carry out regular maintenance checks on equipment and machinery and maintain log books and data records.
- Assist with consultations with Traditional Owners, communities, stakeholders and partners, and provide general cultural guidance to the program.
- Attend various forums and exchanges as a representative of the NLC.
- Comply with NLC policy and procedures at both an organisational and operational level, ensuring that appropriate standards and operational protocols are maintained at all times.
- Perform any other reasonable tasks and duties that are required, that are within the scope of your position classification, service area and skill set as required.
- Adhere to the NLC Code of Conduct and work in a manner which is professional, respectful, and collaborative to foster sound working relationships within your immediate team and the broader organisation.
- Actively participate in performance enhancement processes and learning and development requirements of your role.
- Ensure your personal health and safety and that of others by undertaking your duties and tasks in a safe manner.
- Report all hazards and incidents to your direct supervisor immediately and complete all incident reporting requirements within the timeframes specified.



POSITION REQUIREMENTS

ESSENTIAL REQUIREMENTS

- Have a strong interest in Land and Sea Management works.
- Have a place to live on the Land Trust or nearby community.
- Have the capacity to acquire new skills.
- Be able to talk and write in basic English.
- Be willing to work outdoors and undertake physical work.
- Sound cross-cultural and interpersonal skills with an ability to effectively work in a team and build and maintain respectful working relationships with colleagues' constituents and external stakeholders.

DESIRABLE REQUIREMENTS

- Previous experience and/or qualifications in Land and Sea Management.
- Current C Class Drivers Licence and the ability and willingness to undertake remote travel in a manual 4WD vehicle.
- A current OCHRE Card (Working with Children) or an ability to acquire one

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
