Genazzano FCJ College is a high performing Catholic day and boarding school beginning with the Early Learning Centre (co-educational 3 and 4-year-old kindergarten) and girls only education from Preparatory to Year 12.

POSITION PURPOSE

The Cello Tutor is responsible for the tutoring of cello to private instrumental students at Genazzano FCJ College.

POSITION OBJECTIVES

- To provide exceptional tuition to cello students by tutoring them to become aware of and how to respond to harmony, rhythm, and musical phrasing.
- To tutor cello students to understand the need for developing a strong technical foundation that will support their musicality.
- To encourage cello students to join a co-curricular ensemble so they may reap the many benefits gained from ensemble participation

KEY RESPONSIBILITY AREAS

The duties relative to this position are that the Cello Tutor will:

- Play a key role in the tutoring of cello students across the College (Prep Yr 12)
- Tutor private students and to prepare and present students for recitals, competitions, Master Classes, AMEB examinations, VCE examinations and tertiary entrance auditions where applicable.

- Organise, co-ordinate and supervise AMEB rehearsals and examinations
- Instruct in the Year 5 and 6 Program on Thursday mornings
- Conduct various string ensembles and/or chamber ensembles as requested
- Develop a positive relationship with all students, from all levels throughout the College which will engender a willingness to participate in our extensive music co-curricular program
- Assist at concerts, recitals, workshops and music camps if required
- Maintain regular communication with parents regarding the progress of students
- Liaise scheduled rehearsals with students, accompanists and parents in a clear manner
- Be responsible for timetabling of lessons, writing of reports and other administrative duties as required
- Meet regularly with the Head of Strings to review students' progress and other relevant matters
- Attend Music Department Staff Meetings upon request

ACCOUNTABILITY & EXTENT OF AUTHORITY

- The cello tutor is accountable to the Principal through the Director of Music
- For implementation of Child Safe Standards, this position is accountable to the Deputy Principal

- The position must ensure that it operates in accordance with the specific objectives, policies
 and strategies determined for the effective management of the College's resources and ensure
 decisions made by the position are subject to review by the Director of Music.

- Ability to identify priorities, work within timeframes and meet deadlines
- Ability to work effectively both autonomously and in a team environment
- Committed to ongoing professional development
- An energetic, passionate, experienced and inspirational music educator

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT
