Position Objective

This position is accountable to the Manager City Infrastructure for the provision of general civil engineering responsibilities associated with new and replacement municipal assets and their maintenance.

This position requires a collaborative approach with other staff and may require community engagement about these projects. Engineering Strategy and Assets

Key Responsibilities

During the work experience a written report of an agreed project covering all aspects of a project under construction while employed and the asset implications must be completed.

To enable this to occur, work will be provided in the following areas:

- Engineering Project: undertake an engineering project as per brief provided during selection process.
- Assist the Coordinator Engineering Design to design a small project, or part of a large project.
- Assist the Coordinator Transport, Strategy and Assets to collect traffic data, design a traffic
 control and undertake a consultation process and prepare a report. Assist with preparing
 materials for asset management plans and with programming of maintenance activities for
 roads, footpaths, bus stops, public lighting and bridges.
- Assist the Coordinator Engineering Projects with construction activities and project management.
- Provide an outstanding level of customer service to all customers by answering enquiries promptly and effectively.

- Follow defined records management practices, policies and procedures for all records created and received.
- Positively contribute to our constructive culture by living our values which guide decision making and delivery of outcomes for our community.
- Actively deliver an innovative customer experience that's effortless, delivered with care and exceeds our customers' expectations.
- Responsible for being actively involved in the identification and management of the day-to-day risks of their activities and projects.
