ABOUT MENZIES:

SUMMARY OF THE POSITION:

This position will support Menzies' work on several projects focusing on Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) in Timor-Leste. Specific project details are included in the statement of duties.

The Health resource development and Partnership officer will be supervised by *Project manager AMR Timor-Leste*

The Health resource and Partnership officer will provide support to the project management team in liaising and coordinating activities with international partners and donors (Department of Health and Social Care through UKaid, and Welcome Trust) involved with the work related to Antimicrobial Resistance. This includes projects such as the Fleming Fund Country Grant to Timor-Leste, and Centres for Antimicrobial Optimisation network (CAMO-Net). The role will also involve working with the technical teams to identify and develop health resources, including, but not limited to resources used for training purposes.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES:

The following key responsibilities are not exhaustive and may include others as directed by the Project manager AMR Timor-Leste at Menzies School of Health Research Timor-Leste.

- Collaborate closely with Menzies project teams and other stakeholders to identify and develop health promotion and/or training materials which will support work towards achieving project objectives.
- Regularly measure and report on performance/effectiveness of health resources developed and campaigns against goals and key indicators of public acceptance.
- Develop productive, cooperative working relationships with government and



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international partners, Menzies Timor-Leste team and Office Support team, as well as any other international collaborators.

• Organise formal meetings and workshops to ensure good coordination and collaboration with international partners.

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- Demonstrate and maintain an understanding and awareness of relevant Workplace Health and Safety as well as Equal Opportunity principles and legislation along with a commitment to maintaining a healthy and safe workplace.
- Any other tasks as reasonably required by the Supervisor, Project Leads or Country Manager.

STATEMENT OF DUTIES: Resource development and Partnership officer

Menzies has been implementing the Fleming Fund Country Grant since 2019, and it has a strong focus on strengthening antimicrobial resistance (AMR) and antimicrobial use (AMU) surveillance systems through building laboratory, clinical and surveillance capacity in both the human and animal health sectors. The project facilitates a stronger One Health approach to surveillance, bringing together multi-sectoral stakeholders to share surveillance data and gain a better understanding of AMR, AMU and AMC.



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The first Fleming Fund Country Grant focused mostly at National level, with activities in partnership with Laboratorio Nacional da Saude (LNS), Hospital Nacional Guido Valadares (HNGV), Surveillance department at Ministry of Health (MOH), the Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory (VDL) and National Directorate of Veterinary (NDV) at Ministry of Agriculture (MAF). The second Fleming Fund Country Grant which commenced in April 2021 has seen an expansion of the activities into the municipalities, through strengthening the microbiology service in the municipal referral hospitals, and also supporting AMR and AMU surveillance in animal health at municipal level. The second phase of the project involves collaboration with a number of international partners implementing the Fleming Fellowship program and Fleming Fund Regional Grants.

CAMO-Net is a unique global partnership, aimed at addressing AMR and support antimicrobial optimisation for use in humans. The work is underpinned by the values of equity, local leadership, co-production of activities, knowledge mobilisation, mutual cross-regional learning, training, capacity and capabilities strengthening, and output sharing. Menzies works in collaboration with the Universidade de Paz (UNPAZ) in Dili to implement CAMO-Net, together with several international partners.

Specific responsibilities for the project(s) will include:

- Support the human health and animal health team to identify and develop/ revise health promotion and/or training resources to support their work on AMR.
- Regularly measure and report on performance/effectiveness of health resources developed and campaigns against goals and key indicators of health professional and/or public acceptance.
- Develop and maintain productive, cooperative working relationships with government and international partners, Menzies Timor-Leste team and Office Support team, as well as any other international collaborators.
- Provide guidance to relevant international project partners unfamiliar with Timor-Leste, to ensure context-specific, consistent and quality messages, which align with project objectives.
- Maintain up-to-date database of members from international partners involved with AMR projects in Timor-Leste
- Organise meetings with international partners to ensure good coordination and collaboration, including compiling meeting notes.
- Coordinate visits to Timor-Leste from international partners and donors.
- Coordinate and provide logistical support for Menzies TL staff and staff from government partners when travelling overseas to attend conferences and training.
- Any other tasks as reasonably required by the supervisor, project leads, or country manager
