The Literacy & Numeracy Intervention support person is responsible for supporting student achievement in literacy & numeracy across the learning domains. Under the direction of the Literacy & Numeracy Learning Leaders, the Literacy & Numeracy Intervention support person provides small group instruction to students who have been identified as benefiting from additional support. Following a predesigned program, this position is responsible for monitoring, reporting, and communicating student progress and performance with subject teachers and the Literacy & Numeracy Learning Leaders.

- Conducts ongoing formative and summative assessments to identify needs and monitor progress.
- Provides input for program development
- Demonstrated ability to work independently
